GENERAL

American Jewish League for Israel

AJLI offers scholarships for a full year of study in Israel. Acceptance to Pardes is a prerequisite. There is no age restriction, but US citizenship or permanent residency is required. JNF "Plant Your Way to Israel"

Students through age 30 ask friends and family to contribute to JNF. A portion of the donation goes to JNF to plant trees in Israel, and the other half will be placed in a special account for the student, held by JNF, to be used for any trip to Israel. A special certificate is sent to a designee on behalf of the donor. Participants can register at www.inf.org/pyw and are able to easily manage their accounts through a personalized fundraising webpage. Students can redeem their funds for any trip to Israel.

American Zionist Movement: Helyn B. Reich Memorial Scholarship (for MASA recipients only) for Post-University Students

Reich scholarships are awarded each fall and spring to a limited number of American students who have been accepted to a MASA program in Israel. The scholarship seeks to recognize candidates who have demonstrated academic excellence, pro-Israel activity in their personal lives and show a commitment to future involvement with the Jewish and Zionist community. Need will be considered, but emphasis is on merit. Preference is given to candidates who decide to spend the full year in Israel. Deadline for Spring 2019 applications is approx. January 2019.
