

September 9

Elul Tour. From the Mount of Olives to the Kidron Valley: A tour of a lesser-visited part of Jerusalem with a fascinating history and spectacular views.

October 28

The Christian Quarter: The Holy Sepulchre (outside), New Gate, the Muristan, and Protestant "quarter."

November 18

The Armenian Quarter: Mount Zion and David's Tomb, the Cenaculum, the Armenians, their history and sects.

December 23

The Muslim Quarter: Damascus Gate, Lions' Gate, and Via Dolorosa.

January 27

The Jewish Quarter: The Broad Wall, Herodion Quarter, Karaite Museum, Crusader market, and Old Yishuv Court Museum.

March 3

Outside the Walls from the First Station to Mamilla: Ancient burial sites, hidden gardens, and the beginnings of modern Jerusalem.
